



Outlining

The purpose of outlining is to organize your thoughts and research so you can write more effectively. The act of outlining forces you to grasp a better understanding of your ideas by arranging them in relation to one another. Here are some rules for outlining:

- You are outlining for yourself and the reader thus, the way you outline for yourself is largely up to you, but keep in mind the reader of your paper will see a formal outline
 - o Informal outlines are excellent tools for writers
 - o Formal outlines are great blueprints for readers
- Ideas of equal weight are placed on the same level within the outline
 - o What's most important to your argument?

Informal Example: Tree Diagram for Forming Arguments³



Formal Outline Example: 2

Thesis (prefaces outline)

- I. First main idea
 - a. First subordinate idea
 - i. Reason, example, or illustration
 - ii. Reason, example, or illustration
 - Detail to support reason
 - Detail to support reason
 - b. Second subordinate idea
- II. Second main idea

Note: each level must have more than one entry. For every A, there must be at least a B. This forces you to compare ideas and place them on a scale of relativity (value & importance).
